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ADJUDICATORS AND OFFICIALS

CHORAL COMPETITION ADJUDICATORS



María Guinand (Venezuela)

María Guinand is a choral conductor, university professor and leader of many choral projects both nationally and internationally. She has specialized in Latin-American Choral Music of the 20th and 21st centuries and has won many awards including the 'Kulturpreis' of the InterNationes Foundation in 1998, the Robert Edler Preis für Chormusik in 2000 and the Helmuth Rilling Preis in 2009.

Ms. Guinand is the Artistic Director of the Schola Cantorum of Venezuela Foundation, and founded the 'Academia Bach de Venezuela' in close relationship with the International Bachakademie Stuttgart and the 'Academia Nacional de Canto Gregoriano.' She served for 12 years as Latin American Vice-President of the IFCM and she is currently Advisor to the Board. For over 30 years

Ms. Guinand has served as the Associate Conductor and Advisor of Choral Symphonic Performances and Activities of 'El Sistema.' She teaches in the Masters Degree Program for Choral Conductors at the Universidad Simón Bolívar.

In recent years she has conducted concerts at the Sydney Opera House, the Barbican (London), Casa de Musica (Porto), Royal Carre Theater (Amsterdam), Teatro Colón (Buenos Aires), Lincoln Center (New York/White Light Festival), Liederhalle (Stuttgart/Europeanmusikfest), Hult Center (Oregon Bach Festival), among others.

Raymond Wise (Indiana, USA)

Raymond Wise serves as Professor of Practice, African American and African Diaspora Studies Department, the Associate Director of the African American Arts Institute and Director of the African American Choral Ensemble at Indiana University, Bloomington, IN. He earned a Ph.D. and an M.A. in Music Education from The Ohio State University (2002, 1996) and a B.F.A. in Music from Denison University, Granville, Ohio (1983). He studied Opera, Art, and German at the Institute for European Studies in Vienna, Austria (1982) and African-American History, Music, and Dance at San Francisco State University in San Francisco, California (1983). His research and teaching interests includes the history and performance of African American Gospel and Sacred music. He is an ordained minister and regularly serves as a singer, pianist, composer, director,



conductor, lecturer, and teacher for orchestras, opera companies, churches and choral festivals throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, and Asia.



Judit Hartyányi (Hungary)

Judit Hartyányi holds a diploma from the Liszt Academy of Music in Choral Conducting and Teachers' Training.

Judit uses music education as a model of the Kodály concept in her teaching (from early childhood to academic level), lecturing and conducting. From 1972 to 2011, she taught at a special music secondary school in Székesfehérvár, at the Teacher's Training College and at the Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest.


She has conducted different choirs, among others the Girls' Chorus of Székesfehérvár, Hungary, which premiered works by many contemporary Hungarian composers and won awards in international competitions. She was awarded the ARTISJUS prize (it is a prize for performers

of contemporary music).

She was the choir leader of girls chorus of the Liszt Academy and Music Teacher's Training Institute of the Liszt Academy, Budapest, 1992-2005.

In 2010, Judit was invited to be the conductor of the Concert Choir at the OAKE (The Organization of American Kodály Educators) National Conference in Dallas, Texas.

Since 1995, she has taught frequently in the Kodály Program at Holy Names University (Oakland, CA, U.S.A.) during academic years and summer institute programs. She has served as juror for numerous international choral competitions



Judit Hartyányi is a Co-President of the Hungarian Kodály Society, and a member of the Board of the Association of Hungarian Choirs, Orchestras and Folk Ensembles. She was a Vice President of the International Kodály Society (2004-2012), and now is its Honorary Member.

SOLO COMPETITION ADJUDICATORS



Martín Benvenuto (California, USA)

Martín Benvenuto is one of the leading choir conductors in the San Francisco Bay Area and beyond. A native of Buenos Aires, Argentina, he has been Artistic Director of the Peninsula Women's Chorus (PWC) since 2003. Active as a clinician, panelist, and guest conductor, Benvenuto has served as Artistic Director of WomenSing, the Contra Costa Children's Chorus, and has been on the faculty of the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir.

Recognized for his exacting technique, and a passion for drawing the finest choral tone, Benvenuto's repertoire is extensive. His choirs are dedicated to commissioning new works from upcoming and established composers from the U.S. and abroad, and have been selected to perform at Chorus America and American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) conferences.

His choirs have also earned honors and high marks in international competitions in Argentina, South Africa, Canada, Hungary, and Spain. Of particular note are PWC's American Prize in Choral Performance (winner in 2015, second place in 2011), the 2010 Chorus America/ASCAP Alice Parker award, which recognized WomenSing for programming recently composed music that expanded the mission of the chorus, and the Third Prize awarded to the PWC at the 2006 Béla Bartók International Choir Competition, one of the most prestigious on the European circuit.

Benvenuto highly values artistic collaborations: his choirs have collaborated with Veljo Tormis, Joseph Jennings, Karmina Šilec and Carmina Slovenica, Charles Bruffy, Quinteto Latino, California Shakespeare Theater, the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus, and the Golden Gate Men's Chorus, among others. Benvenuto has prepared choirs for organizations such as the San Francisco Opera, the Oakland East Bay Symphony, the Redwood Symphony, and the Kronos Quartet. He has also appeared as tenor soloist with leading Bay Area ensembles.

Benvenuto holds a D.M.A. in choral conducting from Boston University, where he studied with Ann Howard Jones and the late Robert Shaw. He earned his master's degree from Westminster Choir College, where he studied with Joseph Flummerfelt, majoring both in Choral Conducting and in Voice Performance and Pedagogy. His undergraduate degrees in choral conducting and composition are from the Universidad Católica Argentina.

Karen Anderson (California, USA)

American lirico-spinto soprano, Karen Anderson has performed the title role of Alcina with San Francisco Pocket Opera, and has been heard in the world premier of Donald McCullough's *Contraries* and the Verdi *Requiem* with San Francisco Choral Society at Davies Symphony Hall. She has performed with the Lancaster Music Festival in the title role of Turandot with a live National Public Radio broadcast, and with Cincinnati Opera in the role of Kitty Hart in *Dead Man Walking*. She triumphed in the performances of Suor Angelica and Tosca to considerable acclaim with California's Festival Opera.

On the concert front, she has performed Mendelssohn's *Elijah* in Israel with the Jerusalem Symphony, Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony*, Mahler's *4th Symphony*, Strauss' *Four Last Songs*, and many other works with professional orchestra throughout the United States and abroad.



FESTIVAL COMPOSERS



Stacy Garrop

Stacy Garrop's music is centered on dramatic and lyrical storytelling. Stacy shares stories by taking audiences on sonic journeys – some simple and beautiful, while others are complicated and dark – depending on the needs and dramatic shape of the story. New Music USA and the League of American Orchestras have chosen Stacy and the Champaign-Urbana Symphony Orchestra as one of five orchestra/composer pairings for Music Alive's 2016-2019 residence program. Stacy has received the Barlow Prize, a Fromm Music Foundation grant, three Barlow Endowment commissions, and the Sackler Music Composition Prize. Theodore Presser Company publishes her chamber and orchestral works; she self-publishes her choral pieces under Inkjar Publishing Company. Stacy is a recording artist with Cedille Records; her works are also

commercially available on ten additional labels. Stacy has been commissioned by Kronos Quartet, Chanticleer, Albany Symphony, Capitol Saxophone Quartet, Gaudete Brass Quintet, Chicago a cappella, Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir, San Francisco Choral Society, and Volti. She has served as composer-in-residence with the Albany Symphony and Skaneateles Festival, and was on the faculty of Fresh Inc Festival (2012-2017). She taught composition full-time at Roosevelt University (2000-2016) before launching a freelance career. Jacqueline Butler Hairston

Award-winning ASCAP composer-arranger, Jacqueline Butler Hairston, legendary former Bay Area pianist, music educator, African Diaspora Specialist, Church Musician, and Vocal Coach, is a Sacramento resident and recent commissioned composer for Maestro Robert Geary's (Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir) 2018 Golden Gate International Choral Festival for 500 singers from around the world. Hairston's A FREEDOM QUODLIBET skillfully weaves text and motifs from traditional spirituals and from Alice Walker's "Joie de Vivre" (O Freedom). The world premiere is scheduled for July 2018 at the Oakland Interstake Center.



A twice invited Carnegie Hall Guest Conductor (2012, 2016), Jacqueline Hairston created and arranged works of the African Diaspora for her Mass Choir of 200 and 300 singers respectively.

Her 2012 Carnegie world-premiere was a tribute to Jester Hairston (her esteemed cousin). Her 2016 program paid tribute to the Pulitzer awardee, writer-poet Alice Walker, internationally acclaimed Jazz instrumentalist Wynton Marsalis, and world renowned soprano Kathleen Battle.

Hairston received her pre-college musical education from the Juilliard School of Music; Howard University (B. Mus.Ed.) and Columbia University (M.A. Music, Music Education). A retired music professor from Oakland's Merritt and Laney Colleges, she taught at UC Berkeley's Young Musicians Program; Choir and Piano at the Oakland School for the Arts; designed a Gospel/Jazz course at Oakland's Mills College.

A Vocal/Piano Coach for over 45 years, she is a member of the Recording Academy (NARAS), previously on the Board of Governors, SF Chapter. A practitioner of Sound-Healing, Jacqueline Hairston created Bay area college courses, HEALING THE SOUL THROUGH AND WITH MUSIC and released her pioneering "healing music" Piano CD, entitled Spiritual Roots + Classical Fruits: A Healing Harvest (available on iTunes).



Kirke Mechem

Kirke Mechem is a prolific composer with a catalogue of over 250 works. He enjoys an international presence, as ASCAP recently registered concert performances of his music in 42 countries. Born and raised in Kansas and educated at Stanford and Harvard Universities, Mechem conducted and taught at Stanford, and served as composer-in-residence for several years at the University of San Francisco. Mechem also lived in Europe, spending three years in Vienna where he came to the attention of Josef Krips, who later championed the composer's symphonies as conductor of the San Francisco Symphony. He was guest of honor at the 1990 Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow and was invited back for an all-Mechem symphonic concert by the USSR Radio-Television Orchestra in 1991.

He has been honored and recognized for his contributions from the United Nations; the National Endowment for the Arts; the National Gallery; the American Choral Directors Association; the Music Educators National Conference, and

was presented with a lifetime achievement award from the National Opera Association. In 2012 the University of Kansas awarded him the honorary degree of Doctor of Arts.

Mechem's compositions cover almost every genre, but vocal music is the core of his work. His three-act opera, Tartuffe, has been performed nearly 400 times in six countries. His extensive choral works have garnered him the title of "dean of American choral composers." The premiere of Mechem's large-scale dramatic opera based on American abolitionist John Brown was commissioned to celebrate Lyric Opera Kansas City's 50th anniversary. Songs of the Slave — a suite for bass-baritone, soprano, chorus and orchestra from John Brown — has been performed over 90 times. His comic opera, The Rivals (an American update of Sheridan's classic play, The Rivals), was premiered in 2011 by Skylight Opera in Milwaukee. Mechem has recently completed an opera based on Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice.

Kirke Mechem was the Honorary Chair of the Golden Gate Festival in 2012.

The text is from The Hobbit by J.R.R. Tolkien (published by Houghton Mifflin in the U.S.A.). Mechem originally composed the melody as a round for the children of a family friend to sing. When commissioned to compose a theme for the 1991 Festival, he reworked his melody into a more formal presentation for children's chorus.

Mother of Exiles was commissioned by the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir for the 2018 Golden Gate International Children's and Youth Choral Festival. The theme of the festival is freedom, and I could think of no better text to express what freedom means than Emma Lazarus' immortal words, written in 1883 and put on a plaque at the the feet of the Statue of Liberty in 1903.

Approximately fourteen million immigrants passed by the Statue of Liberty between 1886 and 1924 enroute to the United States. For these people, her torch was a symbol of welcome and hope for a better life on American shores. - S.G.



RULES OF COMPETITION

GENERAL RULES OF PARTICIPATION

Choirs and vocal soloists competing in the Youth category must be 25 years old or younger (date of birth on or after July 15, 1992). Choirs and vocal soloists competing in the children's categories must be 16 years old or younger (date of birth on or after July 15, 2001). 10% non-conforming allowed. Evidence of birth date may be requested at or before the time of the Festival.

COMPETITIONS

All choirs will participate in the required Historical and Folk Competitions during Competition Concerts. Children's Choirs and Youth Choirs are evaluated in separate divisions. The Festival invites all choirs to participate in additional categories.

Choirs may choose to perform in optional competitions for Contemporary Music and Gospel/Spiritual Music. There is no separation of Children's and Youth divisions for these categories.

Individuals may compete in the optional Vocal Solo Competitions. Each choir may enter up to four soloists. Children and Youth singers are evaluated in separate divisions. Competitors must meet the Age Requirements and be amateur singers. If there is any question as to a singer's amateur standing, please contact the Festival office prior to the Festival. The Festival reserves the right to determine this status.

The Historical and Folk Competitions are adjudicated at public Competition Concerts. Each Choir will have a 25-minute performance time during the concert. Embedded in the performance will be two pieces for the Historical Competition and two pieces for the Folk Competition. Choirs are encouraged to add additional repertoire to their set to enhance their 25-minute performance, but only the 4 pieces selected for the Folk and Historical Competitions will be evaluated by the jury.

HISTORICAL COMPETITION

- A. Each competitor will perform one selection from two of the four historical periods: Medieval/Renaissance, Baroque, Classical, Romantic.
- B. Both selections should be original compositions (arrangements are not acceptable).
- c. At least one of the selections must be unaccompanied.
- D. Timing for the two selections should not exceed 12 minutes. Each of the selections will be timed from the beginning of the musical score to the conclusion of that piece. The judges will ignore any part of the performance that exceeds the time limit.

FOLK COMPETITION

- A. Each competitor will perform two contrasting folk songs from nonclassical styles, one of which must be from the choir's own country.
- B. At least one of the selections must be unaccompanied.
- c. Choreography and/or costumes may be used to enhance performance.
- D. No microphones or electronic accompaniment may be used.
- E. Timing for the two selections should not exceed 12 minutes. Each of the selections will be timed from the beginning of the musical score to the conclusion of that piece. The judges will ignore any part of the performance that exceeds the time limit.

CONTEMPORARY COMPETITION

A. Each competitor will perform two compositions.
 1. A piece written after 1945

- 2. A piece written after 2008, in any contemporary classical style.
- B. At least one of the compositions must be unaccompanied.
- c. Innovative compositional techniques are encouraged. (Innovative compositional techniques may include non-traditional harmony and chromaticism, clusters, glissandi, extended vocal techniques, aleatoric elements, complex rhythms, etc.).
- D. Timing for the two selections should not exceed 13 minutes. Each of the selections will be timed from the beginning of the musical score to the conclusion of that piece. The judges will ignore any part of the performance that exceeds the time limit.

GOSPEL/SPIRITUAL COMPETITION

- A. Each competitor will perform two contrasting songs from Gospel/ Spiritual styles.
- B. At least one of the selections must be unaccompanied.
- c. Choreography and/or costumes may be used to enhance performance.
- D. Timing for the two selections should not exceed 12 minutes. Each of the selections will be timed from the beginning of the musical score to the conclusion of that piece. The judges will ignore any part of the performance that exceeds the time limit.

VOCAL SOLO COMPETITION

- A. Each competitor will perform two contrasting pieces.
 - A selection from the classical repertoire.
 A selection from the folk song repertoire.
- B. Both selections must be memorized.
- c. Timing for the two selections should not exceed 8 minutes. Each of the selections will be timed from the beginning of the musical score to the conclusion of that piece. The judges will ignore any part of the performance that exceeds the time limit.

ADJUDICATION

Competitions will be evaluated by an international jury. Scoring will be done using the recognized international system of points for bronze, silver, and gold standings.

The winner of each competition category will be chosen only if one or more choirs meet the gold standard. If more than one choir reaches the gold standard, the judges will select the competition category winner based upon the aggregate point totals.

The results of the competitions will be announced following the conclusion of jury deliberations, and before the dress rehearsal for the Festival Grand Finale Concert. In addition to the trophy awarded for First Place in each category, additional choirs may receive bronze, silver, or gold certificates based on the scores awarded by the Jury.

The Jury will request performances of specific pieces by First Place Winners of the choral and solo competitions at the Grand Finale Concert. Rehearsal for these performances will take place after the Saturday morning Dress Rehearsal.

Special prizes and Command Performances may be awarded and requested at the discretion and pleasure of the Jury. Such prizes may include: Choir of Angels (citizenship), Command Performance, Outstanding Conducting, Global Heritage, National Costume, or Noteworthy Presentation of a new contemporary music composition. ounded in 1985, the Little Star Chorus is a leading children's choir in China that enjoys a high reputation at home and abroad. As a subsidiary of Shanghai Media Groups, the Little Star Chorus has participated in many big events including the APEC Summit, 2005 Aichi Expo and 2010 Shanghai Expo. The chorus also received numerous awards such as the Golden Award in the 1st China Junior Singing Contest in 2006, the Golden Award in the Hong Kong International Youth & Children's Choir Festival, the Grand Award in the 4th China Children's Chorus Festival, the First Prize in "Charming Campus" National Campus Art Performance for two consecutive years in 2009 and 2010, the First Prize in 2011 Vienna Youth Choir Festival, the Golden Award in 2012 Invitational Sino-German Youth Chorus Tournament, the Gold Diploma in Young Children's Choir and Folklore category of the open competition in the 8th World Choir Games Riga 2014, and the Gold Medal in Young Children's Choir and Folklore category of the championship completion in the 9th World Choir Games Sochi 2016. In addition, the album "Tunes of Vendors" won the Golden Disc Award in 2010.

Having recorded more than 70 albums, the Little Star Chorus has released dozens of albums such as "Song and Smile", "Walking in October's Sun", "Heart to Heart", "Tunes of Vendors", "the One World" and "Ji Gong", all of which gained great popularity among the young generations. The chorus worked with many world-level vocal masters. - 2014 The choir participated in the World Peace Choral Festival in Vienna. Performances were organized at St. Stephens Cathedral, Musikverein – Golden Hall, Muth Concert Hall, the United Nations Office in Vienna and the Austrian Parliament.
- 2015 The choir joined in Canti Veris Choral Festival and held concerts in Prague and nearby cities.
- 2016 The Choir held solo concerts in Oslo and Riga organized by the Georgian Embassies dedicated to the Independence Day of Georgia; In the same year the choir organized a tour in the United States within which it took part in Sing a Mile High Choral Festival in Denver and International Choral Festival in Missoula, as well as it held concerts in the cities of Helena and Bozeman.

 2017 – the choir took part in the international choral festival "The Earth is our common home" in Yekaterinburg.

Professional musician, conductor and director of the Choir of E. Mikeladze Central Music School, Badri Jimsheleishvili (above right) was born in 16 February 1966. He graduated Georgian state conservatory in 1992 (department of conducting). In 1983-1995 Mr. Jimsheleishvili composed pop music and recorded. At the same time he was a composer and a singer in a Georgian pop group "Dream and Reality". Since 1990 till now he has been the director of the chanters group of the church of St. Panteleimon the healer (http://chantersgroup.webs.com/). Also Mr. Jimsheleishvili was a member of the Georgian state choir in 1992-1994. Later in 2004 he was invited to E. Mikeladze central music school as a teacher of Georgian songs and since 2010 he has been working in the school as a conductor and director of the choir. After the choir participation in the World Peace Choral Festival in Vienna in 2014 Mr. Jimsheleishvili was invited to the artistic committee of the festival. The membership lasts till 2017.

he Fairfield County Children's Choir (FCCC) is a community-based choral program made up of over three hundred children in grades four through twelve from communities in Connecticut's Fairfield County and beyond. The FCCC was founded in 1995 to provide children the opportunity to participate in a musical experience that is challenging, rewarding and enjoyable. The FCCC program provides instruction in vocal technique, choral technique, music literacy and the appreciation of music through the practice and performance of great choral repertoire.


The FCCC has performed throughout New England as well as in New York (Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Madison Square Garden & West Point), Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., New Orleans, San Francisco, Hawaii, Colorado, Arizona, Maryland, Canada, England, Ireland, Austria and the Czech Republic. The group has shared the stage with such artists as Renee Fleming, Charles Strouse, Stephen Schwartz, Augusta Read Thomas, Sam Waterston, Christopher Plummer, Sara Watkins and Aoife O'Donovan. The FCCC has performed with many groups, including the Greater Bridgeport Symphony, the Mendelssohn Choir of Connecticut, the American Classical Orchestra, the Connecticut Grand Opera, and the US Military Academy Band at West Point.

Community service events have included performances for the Red Cross, Americares, Save The Children, March of Dimes, Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, and the Fairfield Holocaust Commemoration Ceremonies. In November 2012 the choir made a television commercial in the form of a 'flash mob' for Smilow Cancer Hospital in New Haven. The choir has also appeared, by invitation, on "America's Got Talent." Jon Noyes (above center) is a music educator in the Fairfield (Conn.) Public Schools and is the Music Director & Founder of the Fairfield County Children's Choir. He served as Adjunct Professor of Music at Fairfield University from 2002 - 2012. Mr. Noyes received degrees from the Hartt School of Music at the University of Hartford. He holds a fourth-year certificate from the Kodaly Musical Training Institute and is a Past President of the Southern New England Kodaly Educators. He has completed post-graduate studies with Doreen Rao, Betty Bertaux, Leon Thurman, Edwin Gordon, Gabriella Thesz and Tibor Szabo. The Connecticut Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association named Mr. Noves Choral Director of the Year for 1998. He has conducted all-state, regional and national festival choirs, including the 2011 National Children's Choir for the Organization of American Kodaly Educators at the OAKE Annual Conference.

Donna Beatty (above right) is a music educator in the Fairfield Public Schools. She received degrees from the University of New Hampshire and Wesleyan University. Ms. Beatty has taught General Music and Chorus at the Middle and Elementary School levels and is presently a Music Specialist at Riverfield Elementary School in Fairfield. Ms. Beatty has been accompanist for a number of public and private school choirs, instrumental and vocal ensembles and musical theater productions. She has also worked extensively in church music ministry as pianist, accompanist and director of children and youth choirs, bands and music programs locally and abroad. As FCCC accompanist, she has worked with renowned artists Grant Gershon, Rollo Dilworth and Paul Shaffer.

Portland Boychoir is among the finest children's choirs in the Pacific Northwest and distinct as Oregon's only all-boy choir. It is also among the few community-based youth handbell choirs in the nation. David York, PhD, has been its director since 2000 and leads all five of the choirs that comprise the Portland Boychoir training program. Its mission is to provide music education and professional-quality performance opportunities that develop self-esteem, depth of character, and advanced music skills in boys ages 6 to 18.

In addition to a regular concert series, Portland Boychoir has collaborated with many high-profile artists including Pink Martini, Michael Allen Harrison, Portland Gay Men's Chorus, Bells of the Cascades, Daniel Nahmod, Portland Chamber Orchestra, Revalia Estonian Young Men's Chorus, Phoenix Boychoir, Tucson Boys Chorus, and Matsiko World Orphan Choir to name a few.

Portland Boychoir tours have taken them to Italy, New York City, Arizona, Idaho, Washington, California, and various locations throughout their home state of Oregon.

David York, Ph.D. (above center) has conducted choirs of all ages, sizes, and ability, including the critically acclaimed David York Ensemble, Portland Gay Men's Chorus, and Aurora Chorus. He was the original conductor that gave Portland Boychoir and Ovation! their identities. David holds music degrees from Oklahoma City University (1981 BMus – Voice Performance, Vocal Music Education, and Piano), Portland State University (1985 MST – Conducting, Vocal Pedagogy), and University of Oregon (2002 Ph.D. – Music Composition, Theory). He has composed opera, oratorio, symphonic pieces, ballet, and numerous chamber works for chorus, electronics, and various instruments including handbells, piano, and guitar, some of which have been commissioned and/or published. This repertoire, along with many of his choral arrangements, has received numerous performances throughout the United States.

In addition to his work as conductor, composer, and teacher of music, David is the Music Director at New Thought Center for Spiritual Living (www.newthoughtcsl. org).

After graduating from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music's Preparatory Division, **Gary Skye** (above right) studied piano at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY. He then earned a B.A. in psychology at Stanford University and a master's degree in piano performance at Portland State University. Equally comfortable with contemporary and classical genres, Gary has performed solo concerts in many parts of the U.S. and has collaborated with nationally and internationally touring artists.

An active collaborative pianist, Gary is the accompanist for the Oregon Chamber Singers, the Portland Boychoir and the American Musical and Dramatic Academy's regional auditions. He works as a frequent freelance accompanist at Portland State University, George Fox University, Lewis and Clark College and University of Portland. Gary has previously held positions as a staff accompanist and vocal coach for the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Sonoma State University's Dept. of Music, and the Interlochen Center for the Arts in Michigan.

HOST: PIEDMONT EAST BAY CHILDREN'S CHOIR

OAKLAND, CA, USA



he internationally acclaimed Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir offers children throughout San Francisco's East Bay an outstanding program of music training and choral performance. Started in 1982 by founding Executive Director Susan Rahl with Artistic Director Robert Geary, the Choir has performed with the Barenaked Ladies, Berkeley Symphony, John Denver, The Mark Morris Dance Group, Oakland Symphony, San Francisco Choral Society, San Francisco Opera, San Francisco Symphony, Volti, San Francisco Choral Society, at national and regional conventions of the American Choral Directors Association, Chorus America and Organization of American Kodaly Educators. In addition to its vigorous program of innovative new music projects, commissions, and premieres, the Choir has established itself as a leading force in international choral activities, with far-reaching collaborations, high marks in competitions world-wide, and the establishment of the Golden Gate International Children's and Youth Choral Festival in 1991.

Ensemble from Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir has earned grand prizes, first prizes and gold medals at prestigious competitions across Europe, Asia and the Americas. In the summer of 2017 the Choir received 2nd place at the Eisteddfod Competitions in Wales. In 2014, the Choir attended the International Youth Music Festival in Bratislava, Slovak Republic and won the Grand Prix Award for Choral Music and four gold medals. In 2010 the Choir earned first prize in Contemporary Music and second prize in the Children's Choir category at the 2010 Kathaumixw International Choral Festival in British Columbia, Canada. In 2008 Ensemble was the only choir to win three gold medals at the Grand Prix St. Petersburg (Russia) Choral Festival. In 2006 they earned two gold medals at the Hong Kong International Children's Choral Festival. In 2003 Geary led the Choir to a special award for highest score among equal voice choirs and a second prize in contemporary music at the prestigious Guido D'Arezzo competition in Gorizia, Italy and in 2000 Ensemble became the first and only American children's choir to date to earn a first prize at the Choral Olympics/ World Choir Games.

Recognizing that the creation of art is a forward-looking and forward-thinking endeavor, the Choir has commissioned and premiered dozens of new works by living composers including Sue Bohlin, Kui Dong, Stacy Garrop, Anne Hege, Jacqueline Hairston, Olli Kortekangas, Pekka Kostiainen, Kirke Mechem, Zae Munn, Melissa Dunphy, Pablo Ortiz, Eric Tuan, Mark Winges and many others.

Ensemble (above) is the international performing group of the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir, representing the Choir in international competitions and festivals, and upholding PEBCC's reputation as an exemplary children's choir. Conducted by Robert Geary, the group consists of 49 girls and treble-voiced boys who demonstrate superior musical proficiency and are under the age of 16. The group performs as many as twenty or more times per season, including performances with local symphonies and other arts organizations. Ensemble has premiered dozens of new works, has worked with many composers, and takes pride and delight in the generative process of new music. Ensemble ends each season with a two week international summer tour.

Concert Choir (right page top left), conducted by Tim Silva at the Golden Gate Festival, is the youngest of the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir (PEBCC) Performing



Department choirs. The group consists of girls and treble-voiced boys who demonstrate musical proficiency by audition and are under the age of 16. Concert Choir rehearses twice weekly throughout the school year, performs approximately ten to twelve times per season at various events, and takes a domestic tour of 5-7 days in the spring or early summer. Most students sing with Concert Choir for two to three seasons as they build the skills needed to successfully audition for admission to PEBCC's most advanced choirs. Recent tours have taken them to Denver, New Orleans, Orlando, Seattle, and British Columbia.



Ecco (above), conducted by Eric Tuan, consists of 40 mixed voices in tenth grade or above. Most of the singers have progressed through the Choir program, including the flagship Ensemble, and are dedicated choral artists who have been members of the prize-winning teams in choral competitions. Newcomers to the group find Ecco in their search for a high-caliber ensemble, and are admitted by audition. The group has high standards of artistic excellence and sensitivity and sings a varied repertoire of choral music, ranging from classical to popular and jazz.

Ancora (top right), conducted by Robert Geary, is the treble chamber group of the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir, made up of high school age girls who pass a rigorous vocal audition. Ancora sings almost exclusively contemporary unaccompanied music, performing challenging repertoire in as many as eight parts. Participation in



Ancora represents the fruition of many years of choral excellence in the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir. In addition to their choral activities, members of Ancora study voice privately. Ancora collaborates with composers and other arts organizations in the presentation of new music, makes recordings, performs for public events, and tours occasionally.



Robert Geary – PEBCC Founding Artistic Director, Conductor Ensemble and Ancora

For 33 years as founding Artistic Director, Robert Geary has put the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir in the musical vanguard through his determined advocacy of new music.

Commissions, premieres, recordings of innovative and demanding new works by today's leading composers and collaborations with domestic and international arts organizations have led to national and international renown.

Under his direction, in addition to winning many international competition prizes, PEBCC has the distinction of being the only children's choir from the U.S. to ever win a first prize at the Choral Olympics or World Choir Games. Geary and PEBCC have performed throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Cuba, Poland, Czech Republic, Hungary, Germany, Austria, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Italy, Slovenia, Russia, Hong Kong, China, Taiwan, Malaysia, Singapore, Croatia, Serbia, Spain, and most recently, the United Kingdom.

Geary also founded the professional new music vocal ensemble Volti in 1979 and he has been the Artistic Director of the San Francisco Choral Society for the past 21 years. His choirs have performed at the Oregon Bach Festival, the Newport Music Festival, with Oakland Ballet, San Francisco Symphony, Berkeley Symphony, San Francisco Opera, Mark Morris Dance Group, and Oakland East Bay Symphony; and for the national conferences of Chorus America, the American Choral Directors Association, the College Music Society, and the Organization of American Kodály Educators.

Eric Tuan – Ecco Conductor, Festival Accompanist

Eric enjoys a varied career as conductor, singer, collaborative pianist, and composer in the San Francisco Bay Area. In addition to his work with Ecco, he serves as director of music at Christ Church Los Altos and as founding director of the adven-



turous 20-voice chamber choir Convivium. Eric has sung professionally with Volti, Cappella SF, and the Philharmonia Baroque Chorale, and has worked as a staff accompanist and administrator for Stanford's music department. His choral music has been performed by leading Bay Area choral ensembles and is published by E.C. Schirmer. Eric received his undergraduate degree from Stanford University, and recently completed a Master of Music in Choral Studies at the University of Cambridge with the support of a Gates Cambridge Scholarship.



Tim Silva – Concert Choir Festival Conductor

East Bay native Tim Silva has performed with the Artists' Vocal Ensemble (AVE), SF Choral Artists, Chalice Consort, Marin Symphony Chorus, Foreign Fire, Gaude, et al, and regularly appears with Volti. With Volti, he has worked with

the SF Opera Orchestra, the Russian National Orchestra and the Kronos Quartet, in addition to several composers. He is an active performer with several independent projects, and is one-third of the folk-pop trio Iron Henry. He produces and promote live music events throughout the Bay Area. He holds a degree in Music Education and composition from UCLA. In addition to seven years as music teacher and program coordinator at St. Leander School, Tim has served as a voice and/or musicianship coach for Piedmont East Bay Children's Choirs' Summer camp program for the past three years, and has served several other choirs in the area. He directs Throckapella, a teen-age a cappella program at the Throckmorton Theater, where he is also a section-leader/soloist for the Theater Chorus. In his free time, he enjoys baseball and propagating plants.

Sue Bohlin – Ensemble Associate Conductor, Festival Accompanist

Sue joined the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir faculty in 1984 as Principal Accompanist and since then has served as conductor of Kinder Choir, Girls Beginning, Girls Advanced, Intermezzo, and is currently



Associate Conductor and Accompanist for the Performing Department choirs, where she also directs the theory program for Ensemble and Concert Choir. Sue is the former Director of the Training Choirs, and twice managed the Golden Gate International Choral Festival, where she now serves as Principal Festival Accompanist. With PEBCC she has performed in more than 25 countries. Sue has worked at PEBCC's music camp every summer since 1985 and is a recipient of PEBCC's Founders Award. As a published composer, Sue writes most of her music for various levels of the Choirs and several pieces are with Santa Barbara Music Publishers and Alliance Music Publishing. She led her own children's choir from 2004-2013 and wrote "In Anchor Bay" for them. Sue is a soughtafter collaborative pianist and musician, and works with numerous choirs, symphonies, schools, instrumental ensembles, theater, dance, or opera organizations. She has helped produce multi-media theater, recordings, film music, commercials, videos, etc. She graduated from the Conservatory of Music at the University of the Pacific with a music performance degree and later taught oboe at the National Conservatory of Music in Mexico City. Additionally, she studied solfeggio at Holy Names University and jazz theory and piano at the California Jazz Conservatory in Berkeley. Sue lives in Sausalito on a boat with maestro Robert Geary.



Christine Fernandez – Concert Choir Accompanist

Christine grew up playing piano based on a strong foundation through the Suzuki Method. With the guidance of her parents, who have been Suzuki Piano Method teachers for nearly 30 years, Christine performed all solo graduation and master course recitals

throughout her studies on the Suzuki method. She competed for numerous competitions and performed with many orchestras. She's won in various venues such as East Bay Music Festival, MTAC Alameda County Branch Memorial Scholarship Foundation Auditions, Holy Names University Concerto Competition, Palo Alto Philharmonic Concerto Competition, and subsequently performed with Berkeley Youth Orchestra, Holy Names University Orchestra and Palo Alto Philharmonic Orchestra. At age 16, Christine started to study at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. She holds a BA in Piano Performance. In addition to her parents, her teachers include Roy Bogas, Sharon Mann and Mack McCray. She has been assisting and coaching in the Tchii's Piano School of Music in lessons, ensemble classes, music theory classes, and concerto competitions. Furthermore, she has been in demand for her accompanying in the East Bay Area. Currently she is a staff accompanist and clinician at Holy Names University, Head Royce, Piedmont Middle & High Schools, and Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir.
